“ Matariki, the Māori New Year, means 'tiny eyes' or 'eyes of god' and is celebrated in June when a small cluster of stars called Pleiades or 'the seven sisters' rises above the horizon, bringing the old year to a close and starting a new year.

This is a time to celebrate new lives, and those who have passed on, with kai (food), waiata (song), and haka (dance). It is a time for reflection, planning, and coming together as a whānau.

During Matariki rising, nine stars (from the Matariki star cluster) can be seen from Earth just before dawn without a telescope. ”

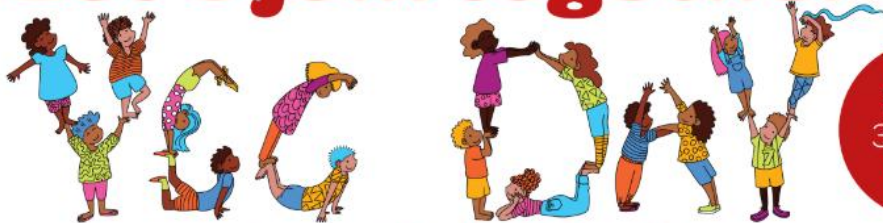
